

Trash, Recycling, Bulk and Yard Waste Collections

Collection day: Thursday

- Remove containers from curb by 10 p.m. Thursday
- Do not jam or overstuff carts
- Lids must close to ensure pick up
- One garbage and one recycling container per household

Yard Waste Collection

Collection by Republic Services: 440-458-5191

- · Collected on a weekly basis throughout the year
- Grass clippings can be placed in clear plastic bags, brown paper yard waste bags or loose in a trash container, not to exceed 32 gallons and clearly marked as "YARD WASTE"
- Yard Waste bags are not required
- Small branches must be bundled and tied in no more than 4' lengths and weigh no more than 35 pounds

City Curbside Brush Chipping Collection

- Brush must be on tree lawn by 7 a.m. Monday
- Brush must be piled in a neat and orderly way with the cut ends pointing in the same direction
- Keep branches as long as possible
- Root balls and logs will be picked up during your designated week
- Lumber, landscape ties, etc. will not be picked up

- Appliances: doors and Freon® must be removed
- · Toilets: separate tank from bowl
- Tables, swing sets (disassembled)
- Household furniture (wrapped cushions)
