The Centennial Home Recognition Program seeks to identify and recognize those houses existing today in North Olmsted that were built in or before 1915, the city's centennial year, in order to acknowledge their local historical significance and importance to the community. Owners of eligible houses may obtain program recognition by verifying their house's age by including with this application such documents and/or other evidence which establishes that the house is a Centennial Home.

Only the legal owner(s) of the property may apply to the Centennial Home Recognition Program. Completed applications and accompanying documentary evidence shall be acted upon by the Landmarks Commission at a regular meeting the applicant is expected to attend. If an application is approved by a majority of the Commission, the homeowner shall receive a Centennial Home certificate and have the option to purchase a commemorative plaque. Receiving Centennial Home recognition shall in no way create any additional obligations or duties for the homeowner, as it is a ceremonial recognition.
