North Olmsted Landmarks Commission Seeking New Members

North Olmsted, OH – The North Olmsted Landmarks Commission is seeking new members to bolster historic preservation efforts in North Olmsted.

The Landmarks Commission meets the second Monday of every month at 7:00 p.m. in Council Chambers and serves as the official steward of the City's historic resources. The Commission is responsible for designating landmarks and landmarks districts as well as reviewing proposals for demolition, construction or alteration of any landmark or property in a landmarks district.

In addition to historic preservation efforts, the Commission also plays an active role in celebrating North Olmsted's rich history. The Commission was actively involved the 2015 Bicentennial celebration, where Commission members led guided tours of North Olmsted's many historic sites. Also in 2015, the Commission recognized the historic Seltzer and Biddulph Homes, former residences of two of the North Olmsted's most influential early leaders. In 2016, the Commission facilitated the relocation of the historic Thompson House to the Frostville Museum, in which an entire 1840s house was picked up and carried via truck to its new home in the Cleveland Metroparks Rocky River Reservation. Future projects and initiatives will draw upon this active outreach to the North Olmsted community.

Qualified applicants must be knowledgeable in a historic preservation-related field such as engineering, architecture, history, planning, or related fields. Interested candidates may submit a résumé and cover letter to Nicole Rambo-Ackerman at rambon@north-olmsted.com. All Commission appointments must be confirmed by City Council.
