The North Olmsted Parks & Recreation Master Plan is designed for people of all ages, interests and abilities, to enjoy an active lifestyle.

What will it look like?

Preservation, updates and upgrades to recreational facilities and parks keep sports and community culture strong, now and in future.

Recreation Center

- New aquatic center with competition pool, indoor leisure pool and outdoor splash zone
- New multi-purpose gymnasium with expanded fitness center, indoor track and program areas
- 1-mile outdoor walking/running path
- New multi-purpose ballfields and outdoor playground
- Fully renovated ice arena and improved parking

North Olmsted Community Park

- Fully rehabilitated ballfields, new football/soccer field
- 1.25-mile walking/running trail, new playgrounds
- New performance stage, renovated restrooms and additional off-street parking

Barton-Bradley Park

- New off-street parking lot with crosswalks and sidewalks
- Renovated restrooms and signage



BUILT-IN FLEXIBILITY

Tax revenues can be used for capital improvements to any city-owned park and recreation facilities. That means there is flexibility to update the plan if priorities shift or needs arise.

IT'S TIME.

Built in 1975, our recreation center has served us well and lasted beyond its expected lifespan. Forty-three years later, it is time to renovate and rebuild these facilities to provide high quality amenities to our residents. This plan reuses and adapts existing assets wherever feasible to stretch every dollar, without compromising on the quality of the amenities.







Fast Facts

- The capital investment is \$43,250,000, funded by a proposed property tax levy of 3.6 mills, breaking down to an annual tax increase of \$126 for a home valued at \$100,000 based on 2017 values.
- ✓ Within the repayment period, two other property tax levies will end, reducing the tax burden by 1.5 mills.
- Construction will be complete in 2024, keeping current facilities up and running during construction.
- Operating costs will be covered using existing resources so that there is no additional tax burden.
- Membership rate increases will be modest and not take effect until new facilities come online.
