COVID-19 Program Guidelines for Outdoor Activities

The North Olmsted Senior Center building continues to be closed to the public; however, staff has begun the careful process of planning and scheduling limited outdoor activities. It is with the health and safety of our members and staff in mind that we remain cautious and diligent to prevent the spread of the COVID-19 virus. Activities and programs will be restricted to non-contact activities such as games, lectures and individual exercise.

The following procedures and guidelines have been established for the health and protection of our Senior Center members and staff.

- Seniors center staff will wear face coverings at all times. Face coverings must be worn by members at the time of arrival and may only be removed once the member is seated in the program area. If a member does not have a face covering, the Senior Center will provide a disposable face covering.
- All members are subject to having their temperature taken (touch free) upon arrival. This is a condition of admittance to the program.
- Members are not permitted to attend Senior Center activities if they are experiencing any symptoms of illness. Per the CDC, symptoms include cough, shortness of breath or difficulty breathing, fever, chills, muscle pain, sore throat and new loss of taste or smell.
- Staff will have the authority to ask a member to leave the program if the individual is exhibiting signs of illness.
- Members must be pre-registered for all activities. Class size will be limited, and registration will be first come first serve.
- Members will be asked to arrive no more than 10 minutes prior to the start time of the scheduled activity.
- Members and staff will observe physical distancing of 6 feet throughout the scheduled program or activity.
- Restroom facilities are available in North Olmsted Park attached to the Senior Center. The restrooms inside the Senior Center will not be available for use.
- Any member who has tested positive for COVID-19 after attending activities at the Senior Center must report the findings to the Senior Center Administrator immediately.
