Trash, Recycling, Bulk and Yard Waste Collections

- · Do not jam or overstuff carts
- Lids must close to ensure pick up
- One garbage and one recycling container per household

Yard Waste Collection

Collection by Republic Services: 440-458-5191 Thursdays: April 6 through November 23

- All grass clippings and other yard waste should be placed in brown bags or in a can marked YARD WASTE, not to exceed 40 pounds.
- Brush and small trimmings must be cut to 4 foot lengths or less, bundled and tied, not to exceed 40 pounds.
- December through March, yard waste can only be put in plastic bags for bulk collection.

City Curbside Brush Chipping Collection

- Brush must be on tree lawn by 7 a.m. Monday
- Brush must be piled in a neat and orderly way with the cut ends pointing in the same direction
- Keep branches as long as possible
- Root balls and logs will be picked up during your designated week
- Lumber, landscape ties, etc. will not be picked up

- Carpet, boxes and wood of any kind must be 4 feet or less, bundled and tied and 40 pounds or less
- Appliances: doors and Freon® must be removed
- Toilets: separate tank from bowl
- Tables, swing sets (disassembled)
- Household furniture (wrapped cushions)
